The latest crime data for Denton County indicate that there were five murders, 95 rapes, 73 robberies, 176 assaults, 543 burglaries, 2,313 larcenies, 169 auto thefts, and one case of arson in 2016. Compared to the previous year, these figures showed that murder (150%), rape (5.5%), robbery (17.7%), assault (23.9%), burglary (34.4%), and arson (100%) rates increased. The county recorded lower incidences of larceny (9.3%) and auto theft (11%). What are Denton County Criminal Records? Denton County criminal records are official documents that contain reports about the criminal activities engaged in by individuals within the county. Denton County criminal record includes reports on arrests and information on dispositions, charges, convictions, and sentences or acquittals, and paroles. The DPS provides criminal records in the state for interested individuals. How Do I Get Denton County Criminal Records? In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Public Information Act, Denton County allows all citizens access to arrest records and outstanding warrants. Anyone can also conduct a criminal history name search from the website of the Texas Department of Public Safety. Users must register before searching the database on the website. The personal review system allows individuals to obtain their own criminal history record information (CHRI). An interested applicant should first schedule a fingerprint scan at a DPS Fingerprint Applicant Services of Texas (FAST) online or call (888) 467-2080. A fingerprint scan costs \$10, while CHRI costs \$15. The applicant should provide valid photo identification and fee payment at the fingerprint appointment. The applicant should submit the fingerprint hard card to the fingerprint vendor. Send the following information along with the card: Requester's name(s) Sex Race Date of Birth The CHRI results will be sent to the designated recipient provided by the requester. For more inquiries, call (512) 424-5079. How to Find Denton County Sex Offender Information? The Denton County Sheriff's Office maintains a list of all sex offenders living outside the various municipalities in the county. It makes this information available to the public on its website. The Sheriff's Office organizes the details of registered sex offenders by zip code. Sex offenders living within municipalities in Denton County have to register with the local police departments in their cities. Visit the county-wide sex offender webpage to find links to registered individuals residing in Carrollton, Denton, Flower Mound, Highland Village, Lake Dallas, Lewisville, and The Colony cities. It is also possible to find registered sex offenders living in Denton County using the statewide registry. The Texas Department of Public Safety provides a searchable database of sex offenders on its website for the public. Enquirers can search by name and map address. Alternatively, they can choose from a list of institutes of higher education in the county to find registered sex offenders living around these locations. How Do I Visit an Inmate in Denton County Jail? The Denton County Jail permits inmates to receive visits twice every week. Inmate visitation can either be a remote online visit or public on-site visit. Jail records for Denton County are available on the county's government website. To find inmates booked into the county's jail, use the search tool on the Denton County Records Inquiry page. The public can find individuals by searching by name, date of birth, and booking number. The county also allows the public to search for jail bonds records. Simply visit the Jail Bond Records webpage and search by the defendant's name, jail bond company, bond status, and bond post date. What are Denton County Court Records? Denton County court records are documents related to the proceedings of cases handled by the courts in Denton County. Court records for Denton County are available on the Records Inquiry section of the county government's website. These include district court case records and calendar as well as justices of peace and county court calendars. The public can access criminal, civil, probate, and family case records for all county and justice of peace courts in the county. To access any of these, simply select a court location from the drop-down list on the Records Inquiry web page or click one of the links on the page. The public can also visit the offices of the Denton County Clerk and Denton County District Clerk to view and request court records. Both offices are located on 1450 East McKinney Street, Denton, TX 76209. The district clerk keeps such documents related to felony charges as criminal court records while the court clerk provides court dockets for misdemeanor charges.
